CCCS Parents,

Calvary Chapel Christian School is offering summer school on campus from June 4, 2019- August 1, 2019. Students who have failed a course and need to make up a class credit, as well as students that want to advance in certain subject matter, may enroll in summer school. The fee for summer school is \$150 per half credit (Clark County School District Summer School is \$175 per half credit for out of district/ Non-CCSD Students). **The student is expected to complete the entire course work by August 1, 2019.**

Calvary Chapel Christian School is also very excited to announce an addition to our Summer School program. We have partnered with Grand Canyon University to offer Dual Credit courses online through our summer school program. Students can now earn college credit over the summer! These GCU Dual Credit courses are 7 week courses. There are around 40 courses students can choose from (listed on following pages).

This summer school program will be fully online and self- paced at the student's discretion. Students enrolled in summer school will have the opportunity to attend Tuesday- Thursday from 8:30 am- 11:30am. There will be a facilitator on campus to help students as needed. This Tuesday- Thursday schedule is to be used as an extra resource for students to get their work done. Students will also have to complete assignments and quizzes outside of the scheduled time to ensure they finish the course by the assigned date.
